



# Embassy Medical Appointment Required Vaccinations

Every applicant, regardless of age, must have a general physical examination prior to the assigned interview. These tests must be done before coming to the appointment at the Embassy.

**NOTE:** Medical exams are valid for a maximum of six months.



**LABORATORY EXAMS.** Applicants over the age of 15 must have blood tests and lung x-rays in addition to their physical exam.

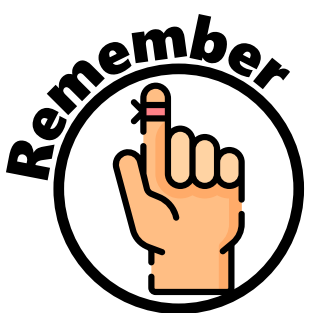
On the day of the appointment with the doctor, you should have the **following information on hand:**

- BGT or CRS case number
- Address in Colombia and the United States (including zip code)
- Dates of birth of all your children
- Email
- Telephone contacts



The panel of physicians conducting the immigrant visa applicant's medical examinations must verify that the immigrant visa applicants have met the immunization requirements, or that it is medically inappropriate for the visa applicant to receive one or more of the listed immunizations. :

- Hepatitis A
- Hepatitis B
- Influenza
- Influenza type b (Hib)
- Measles
- Meningococcal
- Mumps
- Pneumococcal
- Whooping cough
- Polio
- Rotavirus
- Rubella
- Tetanus and diphtheria
- Varicella



All visa applicants should have their **vaccination record** available, at the time of the examination. If not doctor will apply corresponding or missing vaccinations.
